Admission Policy for

BS Programme in Digital Science and Business Management (Batch 2026-2030)

1. Eligibility Criteria

- 1.1. Candidates must be Indian nationals.
- 1.2. Candidates must have successfully completed 10+2 / Higher Secondary Examination or its equivalent from a recognized board or institution in India.
- 1.3. The candidate must have studied Mathematics & Physics as a compulsory subject at the 10+2 level.
- 1.4. Minimum Marks Requirement:
 - General / EWS / NC-OBC categories: Minimum 60% aggregate marks in 10+2 or equivalent.
 - SC / ST / PwD categories: Minimum 55% aggregate marks in 10+2 or equivalent.
- 1.5. The percentage of marks obtained will be calculated based on the board's rules. In case of CGPA, the equivalence certified by the board/institution will be considered. If no conversion is available, IIM Mumbai will convert CGPA into percentage using the formula: $\text{Percentage} = \text{CGPA} \times 9.5$.
- 1.6. Candidate should have been born on or after August 01, 2006 (5 years of relaxation to the candidates from SC/ST/PwD category will be given i.e. born on or after August 01, 2001).
- 1.7. A candidate appearing for the class 10+2 examination is required to submit the 10+2 marksheets by June 30, 2026, in the IIM Mumbai admission portal.
- 1.8. Failure to meet eligibility requirements will lead to automatic cancellation of admission.

2. Application Procedure

- 2.1. Applications for the B.S. programme shall be submitted online through the official IIM Mumbai admission portal.
- 2.2. Admission to the programme shall be exclusively through JEE Main 2026 conducted by the National Testing Agency (NTA).

2.3. Candidates must:

- Apply separately for JEE Main Paper-1 2026 and obtain a valid score.
- Fill in academic, personal, and examination details accurately in the IIM Mumbai application form.
- Upload scanned copies of required documents.
- Pay the non-refundable application fee, as notified.

2.4. Any misrepresentation or incorrect information may lead to disqualification at any stage of the admission process.

Online Application Fees

While applying online for the BS programme, the candidate has to register and pay a one-time registration fee of Rs. 2000/- (Rs. 1,000 for SC/ST/PwD candidates). The application fee remitted is not refunded nor adjustable under any circumstances.

3. Selection Procedure

The selection process will be conducted in **three stages**.

Stage I: Shortlisting Based on JEE Main Paper- 1 2026

- 3.1.** Candidates will be shortlisted based on their JEE Main Paper-1 2026 score, subject to meeting eligibility criteria.
- 3.2.** Category-wise cut-offs will be determined by the Admissions Committee based on:
- Number of applicants
 - Programme intake
 - JEE Main score distribution

Stage II: Personal Interview (PI)

- 3.3.** Shortlisted candidates will be called for a Personal Interview (PI).
- 3.4.** The interview will assess:
- Logical Reasoning
 - Analytical Ability
 - General Awareness
 - Business Management
 - Broader Understanding of STEM concept
 - Overall programme fit

(No written ability or analytical assessment will be conducted.)

Stage III: Final Merit List

- 3.5. The final merit list will be prepared based on a Composite Score, calculated using the following components and weights:

Component	Weight (%)
JEE Main Score	70
Personal Interview	30
Total	100

- 3.6. The composite score will be used to prepare category-wise merit lists in accordance with reservation norms.

3.7. Tie-Breaking Criteria for Final Merit List Based on Composite Score

In case of a tie in the composite score, it shall be resolved by using the rank obtained in CRL (Common rank list)/ category rank list given in the JEE score card (All India Rank (AIR) based on FINAL NTA score).

4. Reservation

As per Government of India requirement, 27% of the seats are reserved for NC-OBC, 15% for SC, 7.5% for ST candidates, 5% for Persons with Benchmark Disabilities (PwD), and up to 10% for Economically Weaker Sections (EWS). Candidates also need to mark carefully the category to which they belong in the IIM Mumbai application form.

As defined in The Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 (RPwD Act 2016), “person with benchmark disability” means a person with not less than forty percent (40%) of a specified disability where specified disability has not been defined in measurable terms and includes a person with disability where specified disability has been defined in measurable terms, as certified by the certifying authority.

“specified disability” means the disabilities as specified in the Schedule of the RPwD Act 2016. The categories of disability are:

- ✓ blindness and low vision,
- ✓ deaf and hard of hearing,
- ✓ locomotor disability including cerebral palsy, leprosy cured, dwarfism, acid attack victims and muscular dystrophy,
- ✓ autism, intellectual disability, specific learning disability and mental illness,
- ✓ multiple disabilities from amongst persons under clauses (a) to (d), and
- ✓ other ‘specified disabilities’ mentioned in 'The Schedule' of the RPwD Act 2016.

For the purpose of being considered for reservations, the applicable Central Government list as on the last date of JEE Main 2026 registration shall be binding. No subsequent changes will be effective for JEE Main 2026 and any subsequent selection process of IIM Mumbai.

The candidates belonging to categories for which seats are reserved need to note and read carefully about the eligibility requirements before applying. It should be noted that while it is the endeavour of IIM Mumbai that the candidates belonging to NC-OBC/SC/ST/PwD/EWS categories join the programme in proportions mandated by the law, the candidate has to meet the eligibility criteria and a prescribed minimum level of performance in JEE Main 2026 & PI

as decided by the Institute authority. The decisions made by the competent authority are final and binding for all the candidates.

5. Offer Acceptance

Candidates shortlisted for provisional admission to the BS Programme at IIM Mumbai will be informed through the admission portal. Individual regret communication will not be sent to the applicants. A candidate receiving an admission offer from IIM Mumbai and accepting the offer within the stipulated date and time, as specified, must pay the fees as per the declared payment schedule. The candidates accepting a seat must pay the initial amount of Rupees One Lakh to secure their seat (admission confirmation).

6. Withdrawal Policy

If a candidate withdraws admission as per the timeline mentioned below, the amount may be refunded as per the following guidelines.

The candidate must submit a written application or an email request from their registered email address to withdraw from admission. All refunds shall be processed via electronic transfer only (to the bank account provided in the admission form).

7. Exit options

Programme Exit Options

7.1. Exit After 1 Year

Award: Undergraduate Certificate in Digital Science and Business Management

Eligibility:

- Successful completion of Year 1 coursework
- Minimum credit requirement as prescribed by the Institute
- Fulfilment of academic performance standards (CGPA threshold)

7.2. Exit After 2 Years

Award: Diploma in Digital Science and Business Management

Eligibility:

- Successful completion of Years 1 and 2
- Minimum credit requirement as prescribed by the Institute
- Fulfilment of academic performance standards (CGPA threshold)

7.3. Exit After 3 Years

Award: Advanced Diploma in Digital Science and Business Management

Eligibility:

- Successful completion of Years 1–3
- Completion of all prescribed academic and experiential components
- Fulfilment of academic performance standards (CGPA threshold)

7.4. Exit After 4 Years

Award: Bachelor of Science (BS) in Digital Science and Business Management

Eligibility:

- Successful completion of all four years
- Completion of advanced electives and/or capstone project / research thesis
- Meeting enhanced academic performance criteria as notified by the Institute
- Students have the opportunity to upgrade to an integrated MBA programme in the 5th year, subject to academic performance and eligibility criteria.

Academic Bank of Credits (ABC)

All credits earned shall be registered with the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC), as applicable. Students exiting at any stage may re-enter the programme (or a compatible programme) within the validity period prescribed by national regulations and Institute norms, subject to approval.

8. General Conditions

- Exit is permitted only at the end of an academic year and on completion of the academic requirements.
- No partial-year exit shall be allowed.
- Exit awards are subject to clearance of all academic and financial dues.
- The Institute reserves the right to specify minimum CGPA, credit thresholds, and assessment norms for each exit option.

9. Legal Disclaimer

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In the case of grievances or disputes regarding academic matters, the existing institutional academic rules will apply. IIM Mumbai will provide an Ombudsman to resolve grievances. The Director of IIM Mumbai serves as the Chairperson of the Academic Council and the appellate authority for all academic and administrative matters. The decision of the Director is final and binding. Any legal disputes will fall under the jurisdiction of the Mumbai High Court.
