Admission Policy for the MBA (Operations & Supply Chain Management) Programme (Batch 2026-2028)

MBA Programme

The MBA Programme is a two-year full-time post-graduate degree course.

MBA (Operations & Supply Chain Management):

MBA (Operations & Supply Chain Management) is a full-time residential programme for graduates from all disciplines willing to choose a career in management.

Eligibility

The candidate must hold a Engineering/Technology degree in any branch from a recognized university/institution with aggregate 50% marks or equivalent CGPA (in case of the candidate belonging to Scheduled Caste (SC)/Scheduled Tribe (ST)/Persons with Disabilities (PwD) category, this is relaxed to 45%) of any of the universities incorporated by an act of the central or state legislature in India or other educational institutions established by an act of Parliament or declared to be deemed as a university under section 3 of UGC Act, 1956, or possess an equivalent qualification recognized by the Ministry of HRD, Government of India. .

OR

Degree from a recognized university with aggregate 50% marks or equivalent CGPA (in case of the candidate belonging to Scheduled Caste (SC)/Scheduled Tribe (ST)/Persons with Disabilities (PwD) category, this is relaxed to 45%) of any of the universities incorporated by an act of the central or state legislature in India or other educational institutions established by an act of Parliament or declared to be deemed as a university under section 3 of UGC Act, 1956, or possess an equivalent qualification recognized by the Ministry of HRD, Government of India in following disciplines:

- M.Sc. (Mathematics)
- M. Sc. (Statistics)
- Dual Degree (Maths and Computing) Minimum 5 yrs.
- BS./B. Tech (Economics) Minimum 4 yrs.

The percentage obtained by the candidate in the bachelor's degree would be based on the practice followed by the institution/university from where the candidate has obtained the degree. In case of the

candidate being awarded grades/CGPA instead of marks, the equivalence would be based on the equivalence certified by the institution/university from where they have obtained the bachelor's degree. In case the institution/university does not have any scheme for converting the CGPA into equivalent marks, the equivalence would be established by IIM Mumbai by dividing the obtained CGPA by the maximum possible CGPA and multiplying the resultant by 100.

A candidate appearing for the final year bachelor's degree/equivalent qualification examination and those who have completed the degree requirements and are awaiting results can also apply. Such a candidate must produce a certificate from the Principal/Head of the department/Registrar/Director of the institution/Vice Chancellor of the university certifying that the candidate is currently in the final year/is awaiting final results and has obtained at least 50% marks or equivalent (45% in case of the candidate belonging to SC/ST/PwD category) based on latest available grades/marks. Such a candidate, if selected, will be allowed to join the programme provisionally only if they submit a certificate latest by June 30, 2026 from the Principal/Head of the department/Registrar/Director of the institution/Vice Chancellor of the university (issued on or before June 30, 2026) stating that they have completed all the requirements (the result may, however, be awaited) for obtaining the bachelor's degree/equivalent qualification on the date of issue of the certificate. Their admission will be confirmed only when the candidate submits the mark- sheet and a certificate of having passed the bachelor's degree/equivalent qualification referred to in the certificate issued by the principal/head of the department/registrar/director of the institution/university with at least 50% marks (45% in case of the candidate belonging to SC/ST/PwD category). It is mandatory for a final year student, who is provisionally admitted, to submit the mark-sheet and degree certificate of the final year bachelor's degree examination held on or before June 30, 2026 (including supplementary exams, if any), to be eligible for admission to the MBA (OSCM) Programme batch 2026-28. The deadline for submission of the mark-sheet and the certificate is December 31, 2026. Non-fulfillment of this condition will automatically result in the cancellation of the provisional admission. IIM Mumbai would not allow any candidate to join its MBA (OSCM) in case the candidate is unable to complete all the requirements for a bachelor's degree on or before June 30, 2026. IIM Mumbai reserves its right to verify eligibility at various stages of the selection process. Applicants should note that mere fulfilment of minimum eligibility criteria will not ensure shortlisting by IIM Mumbai at the various stages of the admissions process.

Criteria for short listing and final selection for the MBA (Operations & Supply Chain Management)
Programme

Candidates will be shortlisted based on CAT 2025 score and concerned reservation category.

Stage I: Minimum CAT percentile cut-offs along with sectional cut-offs to be considered for PI

In Stage I, candidates meeting the minimum requirements on both section-wise and overall percentiles in CAT 2025 as given in **Table 1** will be shortlisted for consideration in Stage II:

Please note that the actual section-wise and overall percentile cut-offs may be much higher than the above-mentioned minimum percentiles as it will depend upon the number of candidates to be called for personal interview (PI) in each category.

Stage II: Shortlisting for Personal Interview (PI)

From the candidates satisfying the criteria of Stage-I, shortlisted candidates will be called for Personal Interview (PI) based on their CAT- 2025 score along with sectional cut offs considering their reservation category.

Stage III: Criteria for Final Selection for the MBA (Operations & Supply Chain Management) Programme

For the candidates who have appeared for the PI, a composite score for final selection will be derived using the parameters and the corresponding weights listed in **Tables 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6**. This composite score will be used for preparation of category-wise merit list.

For final selection process 'Academic Performance & Work Experience Score (APWE Score)' of an applicant will be used. An applicant's APWE score will be based on their percentage of marks obtained in the 10th standard, the 12th standard, the bachelor's degree programme and work experience (as on December 31, 2025) respectively.

Notes about the marks obtained:

- 1. Percentages of marks of an applicant who is yet to complete the bachelor's degree will be computed based on their available marks.
- 2. For computing the APWE score of an applicant, scores in all subjects that appear in their marks-sheet of 10th and 12th Std examinations will be considered irrespective of whether the board considers them for calculating the percentage.
- 3. For the bachelor's degree, the percentage of marks awarded by the candidate's institution/university will be treated as final. If the institution/university does not award the percentage of marks, it will be calculated on the basis of the marks obtained in all the subjects listed in the marks-sheet.
- 4. For the bachelor's degree, if the percentage of marks awarded by the candidate's institution/university does not take into account marks obtained in all the subjects as mentioned in the marks-sheet(s) for all the years, the candidates must produce a certificate from the principal/head of the department/registrar/director of the institution/university certifying details of the practice at the institution/university at the time of the interview, if shortlisted for the same.
- 5. If any board/institution/university awards only letter grades without providing an equivalent percentage of marks on the grade-sheet, the candidate should obtain a certificate from the board/institution/university specifying the equivalent marks which should be used for filling the online CAT/IIM MUMBAI application form. The original equivalence certificate needs to be submitted at the time of interview, if shortlisted for the same.
- 6. For candidates having undergone/completed an integrated master's degree or dual degree directly after their 12th/HSC, the percentage of marks obtained as per their institute/university norms which is considered as equivalent to bachelor's degree will be considered. For those undergoing (yet to complete) an integrated master's degree or a dual degree directly after their 12th/HSC, the percentage of marks, similarly obtained, for the years/semesters completed till the date of application for CAT will be considered.

Note:

- 1. In the event of specific guidelines being issued by the Government of India, IIM Mumbai reserves the right to, depending on the nature of the guidelines, continue with its *PI* as stated above OR use an alternative selection procedure which may include calling for additional information from the shortlisted candidates, a supplementary test or any other suitable process/mechanism. Care will be taken to ensure that candidates are not put to undue inconvenience.
- 2. Final discretion on the academic category that an academic programme will be classified into rests with the Admissions Committee of IIM Mumbai.

3. For candidates having undergone/completed an integrated master's degree directly after their HSC, their classification into an academic category will be based on their academic discipline in the integrated master's degree programme.

The composite score for preparation of category-wise merit list will be calculated as follows in Table 6:

Above mentioned weightages for calculation of Composite Score are tentative and may vary depending on the applicants data status.

Reservation

As per Government of India requirement, 27% of the seats are reserved for NC-OBC, 15% for SC, 7.5% for ST candidates, 5% for Persons with Benchmark Disabilities (PwD), and up to 10% for Economically Weaker Sections (EWS). Candidates also need to mark carefully the category to which they belong in the CAT/IIM Mumbai application form.

As defined in The Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 (RPwD Act 2016), "person with benchmark disability" means a person with not less than forty percent (40%) of a specified disability where specified disability has not been defined in measurable terms and includes a person with disability where specified disability has been defined in measurable terms, as certified by the certifying authority.

"specified disability" means the disabilities as specified in the Schedule of the RPwD Act 2016.

The categories of disability are:

- a) blindness and low vision,
- b) deaf and hard of hearing,
- c) locomotor disability including cerebral palsy, leprosy cured, dwarfism, acid attack victims and muscular dystrophy,
- d) autism, intellectual disability, specific learning disability and mental illness,
- e) multiple disabilities from amongst persons under clauses (a) to (d), and
- f) other 'specified disabilities' mentioned in 'The Schedule' of the RPwD Act 2016.

For the purpose of being considered for reservations, the applicable Central Government list as on the last date of CAT registration shall be binding. No subsequent changes will be effective for CAT- 2025 and any subsequent selection process of IIM Mumbai.

The candidates belonging to categories for which seats are reserved need to note and read carefully the eligibility requirements before applying. It should be noted that while it is the endeavour of IIM Mumbai that the candidates belonging to NC-OBC/SC/ST/PwD/EWS categories join the programme in proportions mandated by the law, they have to meet the eligibility criteria and a certain minimum level of performance in CAT & PI.
