ABOUT IIM MUMBAI

IIM Mumbai has been consistently ranked among the top B-schools in India. IIM Mumbai is ranked 7th in the National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) rankings for 2023 among Management Institutes across India. IIM Mumbai is committed to creating skilled professionals in diverse functional areas like Operations Management, Analytics, Finance, Marketing, Project Management, HR, Information Technology, and Sustainability Management.

Located in the Financial Capital of the country, IIM Mumbai has close interactions with the leading corporate houses, giving it the added advantage of integrating classroom knowledge with relevant practical inputs from industry professionals. IIM Mumbai's picturesque campus is surrounded on three sides by lakes. The lush greenery at the campus has earned it the moniker "God's Own Campus".

With more than 60 Academicians and around 1200 students across various programs, IIM Mumbai is a leader in management education in the country. IIM Mumbai also offers the General Management Programme (GMP) for Defense Officers. All the courses offered at IIM Mumbai are Full-Time residential courses with rigorous academic and industry-oriented inputs.

IIM Mumbai, under the dynamic leadership of Prof. Manoj K. Tiwari, Director IIM Mumbai, is the nodal hub for capacity building in Logistics and Supply Chain Management to promote the PM Gati Shakti Master plan. IIM Mumbai students have regular interactions and sessions from industry leaders and leading researchers, especially in Supply Chain and Operations Management. At IIM Mumbai, eminent faculty from prestigious international institutes like the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT), USA, and the Kellogg School of Management at Northwestern University, USA, are invited to conduct courses for students and working professionals across various industries.

IIM Mumbai has established the Centre of Excellence in Logistics and Supply Chain Management. The center aims to conduct cutting-edge research, knowledge creation, and capacity-building programs to develop India's logistics sector through applied research and industry outreach to tackle real-time business scenarios.

IIM Mumbai also has a vibrant Student Exchange Programme with several partner universities across North America, South America, Europe, and South-East Asia.



DIRECTOR'S REPORT



Revisiting 2023-2024


This year, a significant milestone was marked with the transformation of the National Institute of Industrial Engineering (NITIE) into the Indian Institute of Management Mumbai (IIM Mumbai). This transition represents the establishment of India's 21st Indian Institute of Management (IIM), further adding to the prestigious network of management institutions across the country. This transformative journey is aligned with the vision of Saksham Bharat, a self-reliant India and serves as an important step towards Viksit Bharat-2047.

Transforming NITIE to IIM Mumbai

With the approval from the Government of India on the inclusion of the National Institute of Industrial Engineering (NITIE) in the Indian Institutes of Management (Amendment) Bill 2023, with effect from 16th August 2023, the Institute was granted the status of Institute of Excellence as Indian Institute of Management, Mumbai (IIM Mumbai). IIM Mumbai (erstwhile NITIE) secured an impressive 7th position in the National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF). This achievement is a testament to the dedication of our faculty, staff, and students, whose tireless efforts helped to elevate our institution to new heights. The Institute takes pride in the legacy of 60 years of producing world-class managers who have driven industrial growth across global sectors.

New Programmes

In the academic year 2023-2024, the Indian Institute of Management Mumbai (IIM Mumbai) expanded its curriculum by offering a diverse range of courses across various disciplines. The Institute offered a regular PhD and an executive PhD programme, three MBA Programmes, MBA (General), MBA (OSCM), MBA (Sustainability Management), VLFM-executive programme in collaboration with IIT Delhi, two general Management programmes for Defence General Resettlement, catering to both the core areas of management education and emerging fields such as digital transformation, sustainability, and data analytics. These courses are designed to equip students with the skills and knowledge required to excel in the dynamic business environment.





Human Resource Assets

The Institute has a faculty strength of 58 with 28 Professors, 14 Associate Professors, 11 Assistance Professors, 4 Adjunct Professors and 1 Distinguished Professor, of which the number of female faculty stands at 17. The Institute also draws a number of industry experts and visiting faculty to complement the in-house faculty members. The faculty is engaged in teaching in Postgraduate and PhD Programme, Research, Executive Training and Consulting activities. The Institute is supported by 28 Administrative officers.

Admissions

For the year 2023-25, the Institute admitted 195 students in PGDIE, 281 students in PGDIM, 21 students in PGDSM and 15 Fellow students. After NITIE became IIM, these programmes were rechristened as MBA programs and PhD programs, as mentioned above. We had 32 students admitted to VLFM. The admission notice for the 2024-2026 PG batches, PhD program and VLFM were notified from September 2023 onwards. The admissions saw an increase in gender diversity from 19% in 2022-2024 to 28% due to dedicated efforts by the institute on DEI in admission policy and year around events. This is expected to further increase in the admission of 2024-2026 when the institute will open its admission to all disciplines following the IIM policy. This year, the first convocation of IIM Mumbai was held for two batches, 2020-2022 and 2021-2023, awarding diplomas and degrees to 1014 students across programmes. The programme was graced by Honourable Minister of Education, Shri Dharmendra Pradhan; CEO and MD of NSE, Shri Ashish Chauhan; and the Chairman Board of Governors IIM Mumbai, Shri Shashi Kiran Shetty.

Research Publications

The research publication of the Institute for the year 2023-2024 stood at 208. An increase in the quality of journal articles was observed. Faculty members also wrote case studies and book chapters and attended prestigious conferences like the Academy of Management and the European Academy of Management annual conference. The Institute, faculty members, and staff members have received prestigious awards from global and national institutions of repute. The Institute has a total of nine labs and research centres, which are engaged in cutting-edge academic and sponsored research, organizing conferences, and providing training to students and industry professionals.

Outreach Programmes

The outreach programme of the Institute includes consulting training in the form of Management Development Programmes (MDP) and Unit Based Programmes (UBP). The Institute completed eight consulting projects, and another seven are in progress. During the year, the institute trained 465 professionals, completing 28 MDPs, and 1765 professionals through 51 UBPs. The Institute offered a special program for defence veterans. Two batches of the six-month program trained around 100 plus officers of the armed forces, making them ready for their second career in the corporate sector. The Institute also offered a 10-day Independent Director Program for senior defence veterans. This year, a total of 62 decorated officers were trained across three training programmes. The Institute was engaged in 27 research projects, funded externally and internally. IIM Mumbai undertook six MoUs with International and National organizations of repute.

The Institute also initiated activities with the objective of capacity building. In the academic year 2023-24, around 30,000 personnel were trained under PM Gati Shakti Master Plan by IIM Mumbai (the nodal hub) along with its participant institutions. The Institute was involved in other capacity-building programmes, regional research projects, conclaves, and the publication of books on issues relevant to the country and critical to the Viksit Bharat-2047 vision of the country.



Student Activities at Campus

The Institute has a vibrant student community across its programme, and these students work as ambassadors of the Institute through their academic performance, internships, and placements. For the year 2023-24, out of the 480 students seeking a summer internship, all of them got placed with an average stipend of Rs. 1,14,795 and a median stipend of Rs. 1,00,000 in domestic companies. For the annual placement, 144 companies visited the campus. They recruited 446 students (170 of them received PPOs), offering a median salary of Rs. 29,50,000.

The students also enriched the campus life with a multitude of activities throughout the year 2023-24, like Avartan (the flagship annual industry meet of the Institute), which included a plethora of conclaves, panel discussions, and leadership talks by the topmost leaders from the policymakers and industry. This event also included case competitions, sporting activities, and cultural activities involving not only the IIM Mumbai students but attracted students from other leading academic institutions. Apart from this, the students organized many activities throughout the academic year in the fields of diversity, equity and inclusion, finance, strategy, supply chain, sustainability, and analytics under the guidance of the respective faculty team. The students of IIM Mumbai also participated in various competitions across management disciplines and won accolades, 61 of which were by ranking among the top three prize winners in these competitions.

The legacy of NITIE and now IIM Mumbai is carried forward by the illustrious alumni of the Institute. The alums actively contributed to various institute activities such as Abhisanskran (orientation programme for the new students), leadership talks, winter projects, mock interviews, and Tarang sessions to support the current students of the Institute in their preparation for internship and final placements. The Institute also engaged with its alumni through the annual alum meet (Sansmaran) and multiple regional alums meet (Anusmriti). The Institute also facilitated the annual general body meeting and two executive committee meetings of the Alumni Association. A monthly newsletter showcasing the professional activities of its alumni was published during the 2023-24 academic year.

Institution activities

The Institute engaged in activities like the first convocation of IIM, Indian Knowledge System Workshop, PhD colloquium, POSH and RTI lecture, Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat Program, Fit-India initiative, Hindi implementation activities and other Institute welfare activities.

Infrastructural Support System

The academic and outreach activities of IIM Mumbai have been effectively supported by its knowledge centres, library and computer centres through the procurement of new books, journals, software and databases in 2023-24. In the years 2023-24, the Institute also undertook infrastructural activities to revamp its facilities. The Institute also provides health facilities through its dispensary. The audited accounts of the Institute are also included in the report.

The Way Forward

The year 2023-24 has been a very important milestone for NITIE, which completed its 60th year and began its journey as the 21st IIM of the country. The Institute and all its constituents have engaged in numerous activities with an envigored enthusiasm to take IIM Mumbai to greater heights of accomplishments and success.

BEHAVIOURAL ANALYTICS LAB

Coordinator: Prof. Sumi Jha

Project 1- Test of candidates Integrity and chances of Misappropriation of funds- CMS Infosystems Ltd

Integrity is the 'perceived pattern of alignment between an employee's words and deeds. It entails both the perceived fit between espoused and enacted values, and perceived promise-keeping' (Simons, 2002). The construct of integrity is related to other constructs such as trust, credibility, and psychological contracts (Davis and Rothstein, 2006; Simons, 2002). Integrity was related to higher job satisfaction, which prior research has found to be positively related to a variety of important outcomes, such as employee commitment and job performance. Similarly, integrity was negatively related to stress, absenteeism, and poor employee health, each of which may impact organizational performance in terms of productivity and increased costs (as well as the quality of life of the employee). Two major reasons why employees may lack integrity are because they have desires inconsistent with moral values and because a person may succumb to social pressure. The team investigated two main objectives:

- i. Organizations increasingly rely on algorithmbased HR decision-making to monitor their employees. This trend is reinforced by the technology industry claiming that its decisionmaking tools are efficient and objective, downplaying their potential biases. Therefore, the project will investigate:
- ii. What are the demographic attributes which differentiate an individual's integrity? How to identify employees with high and low integrity? How does an employee's integrity impact their productivity? How to identify fence sitters and their impact on indulgence in fraud?

Project 2- Competency Mapping for School Headmasters/ Headmistresses/Principals in Andhra Pradesh, India: A Descriptive and

Inferential Analytics Approach-Piramal (Kaivalya Education Foundation), a World Bank Project

The field of education is recognized globally as a vital pillar for societal development and progress. School leadership, specifically the role of headmasters/headmistresses/principals, holds significant influence in shaping the quality of education and overall school performance. The state of Andhra Pradesh, located in southern India, is home to a vast number of educational institutions where these educational leaders play a crucial role in managing schools, overseeing academic programs, and ensuring the effective utilization of resources.

To achieve educational excellence, it is imperative to assess the competencies of school headmasters/headmistresses/principals comprehensively. Competencies refer to the skills, knowledge, and behaviors required to fulfill specific roles successfully. Competency mapping offers a systematic framework to evaluate and analyze the proficiency levels of educational leaders across various dimensions, enabling evidence-based decision-making and targeted interventions.

Scope and need of the research

This research project focuses on competency mapping for school headmasters/headmistresses/ principals in the state of Andhra Pradesh, India. The study aims to analyze data collected from approximately 22,000 individuals who completed a survey assessing their proficiency levels across 12 competencies. The project's scope encompasses both descriptive analytics to understand the average competency levels and inferential analytics to explore relationships between competencies and various factors such as region, age, and gender.

The need for this research arises from the recognition that effective school leadership is fundamental to achieving educational excellence. By evaluating the competencies of school headmasters/headmistresses/principals, educational authorities, policymakers, and school management can gain



valuable insights into the current state of leadership capabilities and identify areas for improvement. This research aims to contribute to evidence-based interventions and recommendations that can enhance the professional development and effectiveness of school leaders in Andhra Pradesh, ultimately fostering improved educational outcomes.

Project 3- Design of survey questionnaires and analysis of the findings to capture the needs of potential employers- TVSM

Indian manufacturing industries as a whole resorted to engaging a large proportion (80%) of team members (Shop floor workers) on tenure-based employment which varies from 1 year to 3 years. They are hired from secondary/senior secondary/industrial training institutes/polytechnics. They work in a narrow area of manufacturing with which they are unable to learn employable skills for their future career at higher levels like team leaders, supervisors, and engineers.

India has established few national standards such as National Skills Qualification Framework and National Education Policy 2020 which provide guidelines for continuing education with multiple entry and exit aligned to their career. However, both the industries and academic institutions don't offer appropriate opportunities to pursue such education that can provide employability and career post their tenure

Hence, the large workforce part of this program is not fully engaged resulting in morale and attrition. TVSM is evolving a holistic framework for providing employability for the tenure based employees based on the needs of potential employers.

Objectives

To facilitate career growth of tenure-based employees and ensure a secured career path, TVSM plans to undertake a study. The study will attempt to understand the skill and job requirements of organisations where the tenure based employees may be placed. Hence the objectives of the study are:

1. To capture the explicit and implicit needs of the employers.

- 2. To quantify and identify the job roles on demand for blue collar workers.
- 3. To identify the futuristic job roles to ensure a career path.
- 4. To identify the annual recruitment pattern of potential employers.

To fulfill the above objectives IIM Mumbai has been entrusted with the task of developing a questionnaire to extract specific relevant information and study the pattern in the data by conducting data analysis

Project 4: Piramal Group: School student performance analysis

Objectives of the Endline Assessment

- To track the progress of students over the course of the academic period. This helps in understanding how much students have learned and grown since the last assessment or baseline assessment.
- To assess the status of student performance on reading literacy, mathematics literacy, and science literacy assessment items derived from PISA standards and adapted for classes 6-8 of Rajasthan government schools.
- To identify the difficulty level of the test items against student performance and derive implications for pedagogy.
- To analyze the relationship between student performance and type of block and derive implications for planning.
- 5. To compare the performance of blocks where PFEL has direct intervention, indirect intervention, and no-intervention.

Key Findings

Grade 7: Male vs. Female

In Grade 7, the performance across subjects shows distinct patterns for both genders.

Males have a moderate performance in Language, but excel significantly in Maths, with a Grade reaching 138, indicating a strong grasp of the subject. Their science performance is decent, standing at 61%, but lower compared to Maths.



Females in this Grade perform well across all subjects, outperforming males in both Language and Maths with Grade of 49 and 146, respectively. However, their science performance, while good at 56, lags slightly behind that of the males.

Grade 8: Male vs. Female

For Grade 8, males show improved performance in all subjects compared to Grade 7. Their Language Grade increases to 55, and their Maths performance, while slightly lower than in Grade 7, remains strong at 125. Notably, their Science percentage jumps to 127, highlighting a significant improvement.

Females also perform well, with percentages of 59 in Language and 144 in Maths, maintaining a lead over males in these subjects. Their science performance, while strong at 112, is slightly lower than that of the males, indicating a competitive edge in this subject for the males.

Grade 9: Male vs. Female

In Grade 9, the performance dynamics change notably.

Males show a decline in their percentages across all subjects, with Language dropping to 39, Maths to 101, and Science to -13, the latter indicating a significant drop below the baseline.

Females, while maintaining a consistent performance in Language with a percentage of 40, show a substantial decline in science, dropping to -85. However, they still perform relatively well in maths, with a percentage of 119, although this is lower than their previous percentage in grades 7 and 8.

- 4. **Multiple-Axis Rotation Cutter:** Our innovative cutting tool offers multiple-axis rotation,

- 5. **Twin Axis Big Cutter:** We have engineered a cutting tool with twin-axis functionality, enhancing efficiency and accuracy in heavyduty cutting applications.
- Sliding Mechanism for Welding Helmet: We have implemented a sliding mechanism in welding helmets, allowing for easy adjustment and improved usability during welding operations.
- 7. **Adjustment Mechanism for Welding Helmet:**We have added adjustable support to the welding helmet, which helps the user adjust the helmet while working at an angular surface.

CENTER FOR SUSTAINABILITY MANAGEMENT

The Centre for Sustainability Management (CSM) is currently overseeing three projects centred around the Life Cycle Assessment (LCA) of beverages produced by Diageo. In its commitment as a socially responsible corporation, Diageo places utmost importance on delivering products that are both safe and of high quality to consumers. As part of their ongoing efforts to enhance the sustainability of their product mix and operating procedures, Diageo India is undertaking a cradle-to-grave LCA for various beverages through the utilization of the GaBi Tool. This study seeks to provide a thorough



and all-encompassing analysis of the products and processes involved, including aspects such as raw material sourcing, manufacturing operations, product use, and end-of-life management. By adopting a systemic cradle-to-grave approach, the initiative aims to minimize the risks associated with suboptimal decision-making and the shifting of problems from one phase of the life cycle to another or from one environmental impact category to another. In undertaking this assessment, valuable insights are expected to be gained on how actions taken at different stages of the product or process life cycle can result in ripple effects upstream or downstream, reaching far beyond the immediate point of intervention.

A detailed examination of past studies on the LCA of plastics has brought attention to the pressing global

plastic crisis. It has underscored the significance of biodegradable Linear Low-Density Polyethylene (LLDPE) and highlighted the potential benefits of bioplastics. Recognizing the gaps in current research efforts, an investigation was carried out for NICHEM Solutions company to conduct a comprehensive cradle-to-grave LCA study. This study focused on analyzing NICHEM's additive, LLDPE, and the biodegradable film made from it. The study has recently been successfully concluded, and a publication of the same has been communicated.

An internal sponsored project of 3 months is underway to analyze the sustainability reporting in India.

One Research Associate engineer was recruited for the year for the above four projects. Three interns were hired for the sustainability reporting project

The Data Science Lab (DSL) laboratory was established at IIM Mumbai (erstwhile NITIE) in 2021. On a regular basis, the library uploads a soft copy of the Thesis on the platform for wider use. Up to March 31st 2024, library uploaded 68 theses. The library is pleased to note that the IIM Mumbai has the highest number of submitted theses among the IIMs available on the eShodhSindhu platform.



5. <u>Library Management Software and Security</u> <u>System:</u>

The IIM Mumbai Library is using "LIBSYS.10 – Webcentric Version" as library management software. For library security, the entire collection is barcodeenabled. The upgradation of the LMS has been done during the year.

Additionally, the **Library Infrastructure Development Committee** meeting was held on 1st
November 2023. The committee was constituted by
the Competent Authority in taking the view to make
the library more user friendly and give an aesthetic
look. During the meeting, the recommendations that
were made were kept on hold due to the Institutelevel Infrastructure drive.

9. Book Exhibitions:

The IIM Mumbai library has organised two book exhibitions/displays on different subject areas of emerging trends. During the exhibition/display, faculty members and the students selected books for the library collection development.

DIGITAL INFORMATICS CENTRE (DISC)

About Digital Informatics Center (DISC)

DISC Governance:

IT services at IIM Mumbai are managed by DISC, which is governed by the IT Advisory Committee chaired by the Director. The Committee also defines and periodically updates IT policies.

Server Management:

IIM Mumbai has a virtualized infrastructure with three Dell Inc PowerEdge servers running Veeam as a backup platform and VMWare as a virtualization platform. Each of the three Dell Inc. PowerEdge machines are equipped with robust specifications. In addition to these resources, a 6TB external hard disk has been integrated into one of the virtual machines to support the storage needs of a specific application. The virtualized environment supports both Windows and Linux Operating

Systems, providing flexibility and compatibility for various applications and workloads. This setup offers enhanced efficiency, scalability, and resource utilization while ensuring reliable performance for critical processes. IIM Mumbai has hosted institute websites and several other institute applications on the cloud. The backup of the critical application and the ERP being implemented will be stored on the onpremise server.

Software Development by DISC:

DISC has developed a website for the Institute, which is hosted on the Azure cloud. The admission process for all Institute programs has been automated with the development of an admission portal. Additionally, DISC has created websites for conferences, global certification programs, and a recruitment portal for teaching and non-teaching positions. Many academic and administrative





applications have been developed in-house, primarily on PHP and MySQL platforms.

ERP and LMS Implementation:

Currently, there is a phased implementation of on-cloud ERP underway, which will help IIM Mumbai with process automation, moving towards a "paperless" office, resource optimization, and productivity improvements. Furthermore, the Ministry of Education (MoE) has designated IIM Mumbai as the nodal hub for capacity building in Logistics and Supply Chain Management to promote the PM GatiShakti Master plan. DISC has also developed the PM GatiShakti portal to display the activities of the PM GatiShakti Master plan.

IIM Mumbai explored the Learning Management System (LMS) for sharing study material by faculties, online submission of assignments, online Quizzes/exams, discussion forums (Course Specific)) and assessments Integrated with anti-plagiarism software.

Outsourced IT Activities:

IIM Mumbai has outsourced Integrated Information Technology Facilities and Services Management (IITFSM) services. However, DISC has SLA-driven support contracts with respective OEMs and service providers in all cases. Under Integrated Information Technology Facilities and Services Management (IITFSM), the workforce under facility management service is available 24/7 for IT services in the institute. The IT equipment, such as laptops, multifunction printers, and desktops provided to faculty, officers, and staff for teaching and official purposes, is maintained through IITFSM services. DISC primarily supports the maintenance of all computer equipment, operating systems, and application software.



DISC Contributing to the success of IIM Mumbai

Software managed by DISC:

The institute has signed an agreement with Microsoft to provide a volume licensing subscription. As a result, all users at the institute will use licensed Microsoft products and email solutions. Additionally, the institute has subscribed to 1 GBI on S/4 HANA and 1 ERPsim under the SAP University Alliance Programme. The institute provides software to faculty members for their academic and research work. The institute has the latest versions of the following software: SPSS 29.0, AMOS 29.0, MATLAB, Bloomberg, ANYLOGIC, CPLEX, Anylogistix, Nvivo, Primavera, Crystal ball, Flexsim, Analytic solver, Statcraft R, Statcraft Python. Various utility software like Quick Heal Antivirus, Adobe Creative Suite, and Adobe DC Pro were procured for academic and official use. All the software is compatible with Windows and Redhat Linux 5 operating systems. For online teaching, IIM Mumbai procured one thousand two hundred fifty licenses of CISCO WebEx, one license for the CISCO-3000 event, and a subscription-based license of Zoom. The Webex, Microsoft Teams, and Zoom platforms are used for teaching, conferences, meetings, and global certification programs.

DISPENSARY

The dispensary is well managed under the supervision of the Medical Officer. It serves all PGP, PhD, and DGMP Students, including all staff, faculty members, and their families. Everyday working hours are from 9:00 am to 9:00 pm, and it remains open for 12 hours. Doctors attend approximately 70-85 patients every day. Emergency cases are handled promptly and immediately during night hours.

The Dispensary has a paramedical staff nurse, pharmacist, and medical officer who remains available 24 hours a day to attend to emergencies. On a day-to-day basis, medicines, including intravenous injectables, as required, are dispensed.

The following visiting doctors were available at the dispensary during the year:

- 1) **Ophthalmologist**: One consulting Ophthalmologist visits the IIM Dispensary weekly for 2 hours and take care of all patients.
- 2) **Paediatrics**: One Paediatrician visits the Dispensary twice weekly for 2 hours.
- 3) **Dentist:** One Dental Consulting Doctor visits the Dispensary two/three days a week for 4 hours.
- 4) **Physiotherapist:** A physiotherapist consultant is always available for 3 hours in the Dispensary

- from Monday to Saturday to take care of IIM Student and Employee community.
- 5) **Ambulance Services:** One fully equipped Ambulance has been hired on contract and made available 24 x7 to the IIM Community.

6) Medical Officer:

- a) Provides clinical expertise in patient care and guidance, verifying complex diagnoses and facilitating treatment plans.
- b) Assists with hospitalisation and coordinates follow-ups for students with respect to their insurance bridging the bond between hospital, insurance and students
- Ensures a high standard of patient care, particularly during emergencies, and refers cases to advanced medical centres when necessary.
- d) In charge of the general administration and discipline of the medical department together with Dispensary staff, managing community level health interventions, and follow-ups.
- e) Manages and monitors the visits of consultants, dentists and physiotherapists.



SECURITY & TRANSPORT

The Security & Transport Section is under the Administration department. The superintendent (Security and Transport) manages the Security & Transport department and reports to the Registrar through Deputy Registrar (Administration).

All the Security personnel are unarmed with no arrest powers; only they can detain a person in doubt or miscreant. Security personnel patrol the entire campus, General support, and VIP/ guest movement support services.

The security personnel are always on high alert. The Institute has 63 acres of land, and its surrounding has been dwelled by encroached dwellers, which is challenging for the security personnel.

Time and again, the encroachers are involved in the construction extension with the present occupied structure, which needs high vigilance and prevention. Whenever such incidents occur, security personnel deployed in Institute premises take up the matter with BMC and Powai Police Station for the legal course. Institute has one security guard (Watchman); Institute has outsourced 58 nos. of Security personnel from Maharashtra State Security Corporation (MSSC).

Institute Security & Transport department has one bus that provides transport facilities to our students. The bus is off-road, effective from 01 May 2019, as it has completed 15 years. However, when the need arises, the vehicles are hired from a travel agency to provide student transport facilities. In addition, the



Institute has two office cars, one Corolla car and the other Innova Cresta Car, solely used for the official travel of the Institute's Director.

The Institute has fencing with Iron Bar on the Campus. In addition, the Institute had taken up work for the RCC wall for the fencing of the Campus, and it is completed. Renovation work is ongoing for three gates, with the main entrance gate already finished. The remaining two gates, the outer gate and the gate on Vihar Lake Road, are still under construction.

The Institute has also initiated the installation of a CCTV system at various key locations.

Assets in the Department: The S&T department has one Corolla Car, purchased in 2013, and the other is an Innova Cresta Car solely used for the official travel of the Institute's Director's official purposes.

The Security & Transport Department had taken up the following activities for 2023-24.

- Republic Day and Independence Day Celebration: The Institute had celebrated Republic Day and Independence Day. Security personnel performed the Parade and gave a guard of honour to the National flag.
- Mock drill on Fire and Fire Alarms: The Mock drill was carried out on Fire safety and Fire alarms.
- Meetings with Police were held with local Police to seek their support in the encroachment and Security related matters.

PM GATI SHAKTI-National Master Plan

As the nodal organization for capacity building in Logistics and Supply Chain Management under PM Gati Shakti National Master Plan, IIM Mumbai has taken multiple initiatives this year to contribute to this mission, such as developing industry-oriented courses, offering courses in multiple aspects of logistics, application of digitalization and data analytics, digital twin, and other state of the art technologies in bringing the required improvements in the logistics sector. As the nodal hub, the goal of training 75,000 participants in the coming years is being actively pursued.

PM Gati Shakti National Master Plan Portal

The website for the registration of various participating institutes under the PM Gati Shakti National Master Plan for capacity building in logistics and Supply chain management has been developed in-house by IIM Mumbai. IIM Mumbai has taken multiple initiatives to collaborate and work with various experts, academicians, and practitioners to foster capability building in Logistics and Supply Chain Management. The PM Gati Shakti NMP Portal of IIM Mumbai is regularly updated with all the initiatives in this domain with an endeavour to advance capability

building. The highlights are shared below:

To ensure the success of the PM Gati Shakti National Master Plan, an important journey has been embarked upon with other academic institutions as the nodal hub. As a part of this capacity building effort, a target to train 75,000 personnel/ students has been set. 






Tarang

INDIAN KNOWLEDGE SYSTEM WORKSHOP

IIM Mumbai, in collaboration with Pragyan Indic Forum, organized a two-day workshop on "Reemergence of Bhartiya Management". This workshop aimed to explore integrating traditional Indian wisdom with contemporary management practices, fostering a deeper understanding of Bhartiya Management principles. A total of 120 participants participated in the workshop, of which 45 were faculty members and 75 were students.





Talk Session by Dr Ram Madhav

Dr Ram Madhav, President, India Foundation; Former Nat. Gen. Secretary, BJP; Member, National Exec, RSS addressed the inaugural session at Indian Knowledge System Workshop with a focus on the topic "India's Vision 2030: Emerging Global Geopolitical Scenario." The discourse centred around the evolving geostrategic landscape expected in the next 10-15 years.

The key points highlighted include the West's anticipated decline, China's ascension, and the emergence of a new Cold War. The discussion emphasized the rise of middle powers, forming a global power axis, while global supranational institutions are losing significance in favour of minilateral institutions and groups such as QUAD, SCO, and BRICS. The world order is shifting towards multipolarity and hetero-polarity, marked by the rise of multinational tech giants and private institutions like WEF (Davos). The session also acknowledged the impact of the new tech revolution, including the presence of digital humans and the challenges posed by climate change, which are causing population displacement and migration issues. He suggested that India should adopt a pragmatic approach, focusing on hard work, ensuring political stability, and recognizing the crucial nature of the next decade for economic growth.



ANNUAL ACCOUNTS

For the financial year 2023-2024, the Ministry of Education (MoE) has sanctioned and released an amount of Rs. 73,48,00,000/- (Rs. 73.48 lakhs) towards Grant-in-Aid to the Institute. The details are as below:

Grant in Aid – An amount of Rs. 21,88,00,000/- (Rupees Twenty-One Crore Eighty-Eight Lakhs Only) under OH-31 (Non salary), Rs. 14,00,00,000 /- (Rupees Fourteen Crore Only) under OH-35 (Creation of Capital assets), and Rs 37,60,00,000/- (Rupees Thirty-Seven Crore Sixty Lakhs Only) under OH-36 (Salary) was sanctioned during the Financial Year 2023-2024 by GOI, Ministry of Education (MoE) to IIM Mumbai.

Total Expenditure is Rs. 1,63,12,13,663/- under OH-31 is Rs. 1,10,82,85,400/-, For OH-35 is Rs. 13,28,19,290/- and OH-36 is Rs. 39,01,08,973/-. Closing balance as on 31st March 2024 is NIL.

The closing balance as on 31.03.2024 under OH-35 (Capital Assets), OH-31(Non Salary) and under OH-36 (Salary) is NIL.

The amount over and above allocated Grant – in – Aid has been adjusted from the Institute Revenue Generated (IRG) of the Institute.

Details of Fund-Flow- Object head wise for the year 2023-2024.

During the Year 2023-24, Institute has received Grant - in - Aid and the detailed fund flow statement is as follows:

OH - 31 (Non Salary)

Total expenditure accounted under this head is Rs. 1,10,82,85,400/-, Actual expenditure of Rs. 69,06,90,583/-. The excess of expenditure for the financial year 2023-2024 is Rs 41,75,94,817/-. Out of this 25% is transferred towards Building fund ie. Rs. 10,43,98,704/-; 15% is transferred to R&D Fund i.e. Rs 6,26,39,223; 30% is transferred to Contribution towards Corpus Fund i.e. Rs 12,52,78,445/- and 30% is transferred to Capital Fund i.e. Rs 12,52,78,445/-. An amount of Rs 21,88,00,000/- (Grant in Aid from Ministry) is fully utilized and shown as expenditure on OH –

An amount of Rs. (7,38,82,299)/- which was overspent as on 31.03.2023 has been adjusted with an amount of Rs. 6,67,01,589/- from the Internal Revenue Generated during the F. Y. 2023-24 as per the fiscal policy of MoE vide F.No.3-6/2019/TS VIII dated 20.12.2019 and approval of BoG minutes no.155 dated 16.1.2020. During the year, the total expenditure accounted under this head is Rs 13,28,19,290/ (Please refer Schedule 4 Additions minus Deletions during the year). The said amount is also reflected under Schedule 1 towards the extent of utilized amount for Capital Expenditure during the year 2023-2024. The unspent balance under OH35-Creation of Capital Assets as on 31.3.2024 is NIL.

OH - 36(Salary)

An amount of Rs 39,01,08,973/- under this head is bifurcated from Income and Expenditure as salary expenditure (please refer to Schedule 15). Since pension and ex gratia are the components of OH 31, the same has been excluded from Schedule 15 (50,48,59,034-11,45,57,245-192816). The unspent balance under OH36-Salary as on 31.3.2024 is NIL.

IIMM ARCHIVES

The IIMM Archives (erstwhile NITIE) was launched on 05.09.2023 with the purpose of archival data collection. The archival team comprised of Prof. Seema Unnikrishnan, Chairperson, Prof. Nikhil K. Mehta, Mrs Jalaja Ramachandran and Mrs Jayashree Nair as the members working under the guidance of Prof. Manoj Tiwari, Director, IIM Mumbai. The team met several times to discuss the plan of action to identify data consisting of the ancient history of NITIE since its inception, i.e. from the year 1962 onwards. It got the support of various departments in gathering data and archival materials from their respective sections in hard and soft copy formats.





Further, as a part of the collection of ancient records on the establishment of NITIE, the archival committee has gone through convocation photographs from the first batch onwards, recorded data on foreign visits and visits of prominent personalities such as Shri JRD Tata and Shri Vikram Sarabhai. The team accumulated old newspaper clippings, models, other historical project photographs, and some of the records of past board minutes, which are proposed to be placed for future reference. 


